Umpiring Update: Lightning, Heat and Inclement Weather

(Conditions of Play Season 2024-2025)

7.1 **Due to heat** - clubs must use the official Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) App and select the relevant BOM weather station location **as per the postcode of the address of the club** the game is taking place at. The postcode will default to the nearest weather station.

The official BOM app can be found here: www.bom.gov.au/app

7.1.1 Play cannot commence:

7.1.1.1. If the temperature at the club's Designated BOM weather station has reached 36 degrees Celsius or above at the scheduled commencement time of the game, play will be suspended for up to 1 hour. If at any stage after play has been suspended the temperature falls to below 36 degrees Celsius, play must be commenced.

7.1.1.2. If the temperature fails to fall below 36 degrees Celsius within 1 hour of play being suspended, the game is abandoned

7.1.2. Play has commenced:


7.1.2.1. If the temperature at the club's Designated BOM weather station has reached 36 degrees Celsius or above at any time after play commences, play will be suspended for up to 1 hour. It is the responsibility of the side managers to record the time that play is suspended.

7.1.2.2. If at any stage after play has been suspended below 36 degrees Celsius, play must resume immediately, with no time given for side or team meetings.

7.1.2.3. If the temperature fails to fall below 36 degrees Celsius after play has been suspended for 1 hour, the game will be abandoned

Umpiring Update: Lightning, Heat and Inclement Weather

- 7.1.2.4. Every effort must be made to complete any ends in progress prior to leaving the green.
- 7.1.2.5. Midweek and weekend pennant games that are interrupted, will be abandoned after five (5) hours from the scheduled start time.

7.2. Inclement weather other than heat:

- 7.2.1. Play cannot commence:
- 7.2.1.1. If play cannot commence at the scheduled commencement time of the game, play may be suspended for up to 1 hour.
- 7.2.1.2. If after 1 hour of play being suspended the game cannot commence, the game will be abandoned.
- 7.2.2. Play has commenced:
- 7.2.2.1. If after 1 hour of play being suspended the game cannot continue, the game will be abandoned. It is the responsibility of the side managers to record the time that play is suspended.
- 7.2.2.2. Every effort must be made to complete any ends in progress prior to leaving the green.
- 7.2.2.3. Midweek and weekend pennant games that are interrupted, will be abandoned after five (5) hours from the scheduled start time.

7.3. If lightning is present:

7.3.1. Play should be immediately suspended if the time between seeing a lightning flash and hearing a thunderclap is less than 30 seconds, which indicates the thunderstorm is within 10km of the venue. This includes outdoor covered greens.

Only venues that are completely closed in can continue play while there is lightning present. Players should go inside an enclosed building and stay inside until 30 minutes after the last sight of lightning.

7.3.2. Bowlers' arms, bowls lifters and umbrellas should not be handled when lightning is present.

A wife comes home to find this note from her husband :

My Dear Wife,

You will surely understand that I have certain needs that you, being 57 years old, can no longer satisfy. I am very happy with you and I value you as a good wife. Therefore, after reading this letter, I hope that you will not wrongly interpret the fact that I will be spending the evening with my 22-year-old secretary at the Comfort Inn Hotel. Please don't be upset – I shall be home before midnight.

When the man came home late that night, he found the following letter on the dining room table:

My Dear Husband,

I received your letter and thank you for your honesty about my being 57 years old. I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that you are also 57 years old. As you know, I am a maths teacher at our local college. I would like to inform you that while you read this, I will be at the Hotel Fiesta with Michael, one of my students, who is also the assistant tennis coach. He is young, virile, and like your secretary, is 22 years old. As a successful businessman who has an excellent knowledge of maths, you will understand that we are in the same situation, although with one small difference: 22 goes into 57 a lot more times than 57 goes into 2 Therefore, I will not be home until sometime very late tomorrow.



December Champion profile: Kelvin Kerkow OAM (Nickname: Spike)



Kelvin was born in 1969 in Queensland. At the age of 7, he contracted Guillain-Barré syndrome which led to him being temporarily paralysed and unable to walk for several years. His parents, Ivan and Joan introduced him to bowls when he was unable to play contact sports due to his limited mobility. He amassed more than 300 international caps with the Jackaroos between 1995-2008 bowling with the aid of a walking stick.

He tells of his childhood health struggles and the strain it placed on his parents:

"I woke up one morning, you know 4:30am in the morning to get up and go to the toilet... I couldn't get out of bed. Overnight, I'd basically had become paralysed. My parents, who didn't know what was going on, rushed me to the local hospital which was the Wondai Hospital at the time.

"I was very fortunate that there was a relieving doctor there had actually seen what I had developed overnight and it was called Guillain-Barré syndrome. It's a virus that completely paralyses you from head to toe within 12-24 hours.

"He knew that was what I had. So I was then rushed by ambulance approximately 350 kilometres to the Royal Children's Hospital in Brisbane where I was completely paralysed, put on a tracheotomy and life support system."

Kerkow's struggles from there were far from over, with the once athletically-gifted child faced with the unthinkable task of learning to walk again.

"The next six to eight weeks was a complete blank. I don't remember anything. It got to the stage where, basically, I couldn't blink. I was lying completely flat on my back and had a machine next to me that pumped my oxygen levels to keep my alive"

"I spent 12 weeks in intensive care and then I spent another nine months in hospital.

"The walking stick I use to this day is actually the walking stick I left the Royal Children's Hospital with when I was about nine years of age.

"In a nutshell, it was three months in intensive care, nine months in hospital and two years before I learned to walk again.

"That's why I took up the game of bowls; my parents had just started playing the game, so they took me down to the local bowls club which was Wondai Golf & Bowls Club.

"I actually had my very first game of bowls from a wheelchair... That was the way my career started."

He first debuted for Queensland at the age of 19 before making his Australian debut at 25.

Kerkow, now 51, created arguably the most iconic moment in the sport's history when he claimed the coveted men's singles gold medal at the Melbourne 2006 Commonwealth Games, after which, he ripped off his shirt and was chaired from the Darebin International Sports Centre arena by his teammates, draped in the Australian flag.

In 2000, Kerkow was a recipient of the Australian Sports Medal. Kerkow received the Medal of the Order of Australia in 2010 for his services as a player, coach and mentor. In 2017, Kerkow was inducted as a Legend in the Bowls Australia Hall of Fame.
